Finished the Trials, What happens now?

On Tuesday 24 August 2010, there will be two workshops for interested students and parents.

Student Workshop: How to maximise your HSC marks.

This workshop will look at what happens to the marks the school submits to the Board of Studies and how you can maximise those marks. It will also look at study habits, study techniques and resources to assist students, including ways to maintain a balanced and healthy life till after you complete your HSC.

The workshop will be from 1:55pm to 3:25pm in the Library.

Parent Workshop: How to support your student to achieve their best possible results in the HSC?

This workshop is for parents of current Year 12 students. It will look at resources to help parents survive the time till after the HSC exams finish. It will explore ways that parents can support their students, including some ideas on stress management. It will also briefly explain what impact the HSC exams have on the marks submitted by the school.

This workshop will be held in the Library at Yass HS and will start at 7:00pm. It is expected to last an hour, however it may last longer depending on parent questions.

Is your child interested in Maths?

A Maths Club is being formed at Yass HS. Initially the club will be for Year 10 and Year 11 students only. The club is planning to meet on Tuesday afternoons, after school from 3:30 pm to 4:30 pm.

There are no initial costs involved in joining and participating in club activities.

The activities the club will be participating in include both extension activities related to syllabus outcomes and additional mathematic activities of interest to the students that will expand their understanding of how maths affects and can predict behaviours in the world around them. Other activities may include researching famous mathematicians and others who have had an impact on how maths is used in everyday life.

This club is an opportunity for students with a genuine interest in mathematics and maths related concepts to gather and share their thoughts, opinions and passion in a safe and enjoyable environment.

If your child is interested, they need to see Ms Young for a permission note to join.
