#### **Indigenous Cultural Excursion to Condobolin**



The next day we visited the Wiradjuri Cultural Centre, where Aunty Bev taught us basket weaving, and Uncle Dick showed us how to throw a boomerang. Then on to Condobolin High School. We looked around their lovely Ag Plot, and then played table tennis and sit down volley ball with them. We learnt that 50% of the students at Condo High are indigenous.



On Tuesday morning we hit the road and headed for the Lake Cowal gold mine. We didn't find any gold, but we did learn a lot about mining, geology and environmental management. We walked on the shores of Lake Cowal and had our photo taken by a drone. Then we headed for home, tired but full of new knowledge and pride in being part of the oldest living culture.

Students have engaged in learning activities that have enabled them to develop and apply skills toward a practical project that they can enjoy upon completion.

Students have utilised class time to research native plants that will be suitable for the garden and draft technical drawings of possible garden designs. Students have had the opportunity to collaborate with Mr McDonald, Mr Armour and local landscaper and horticulturist George Dashwood regarding garden design and layout.
