From the Principal

The Binit Binit (wise owl) learning community, principals and teachers from all local schools, met last week to set the direction with three focus groups for our joint learning projects for 2017.

The Creative and Performing Arts (CAPA) group is looking at coordinating a number of performances including a combined concert in Education Week; the Middle School group will focus on transition programs for years 5, 6, 7 and 8; and a joint Literacy project will run as a significant part of the 6 to 7 transition program. Primary schools will look at how they can access high school facilities in term 4 each year, helping high school teachers better plot student learning data to maximise and support learning into year 7. The Gifted and Talent team have 6 major projects in mind to better cater for the diversity of our gifted students, including elite sporting sessions, a writers camp and a maths olympiad. With the local Aboriginal Education Consultative Group (AECG,) principals are also planning a combined NAIDOC event that includes cultural activities, music, dance and health promotion.

Our local IGA has generously proposed to sponsor a Stephanie Alexander garden at the school, including teacher training. Further information on this to follow.

From the Deputy



Numeracy and Literacy - NALE

The numeracy and literacy experience (NALE) at YHS has taken off this year as we strive to improve all our results over every year of schooling. To do that we are making sure we have a literacy and numeracy focus across the whole school, consistent in every faculty and year group, that changes every 2 weeks.

Deputy Principal Louise Pinson has done a fantastic job reminding staff and students of the focus areas through the daily notices, and she has been brushing up on her mathematical skills at the same time.

Next fortnight (starting with Monday Week A), students and teachers will be covering how to synthesise information to identify a theme for literacy, and will develop their addition and subtraction techniques in all areas.

The mathematics faculty has visited different staff rooms across YHS to demonstrate how students work out their answers – it can be different from when teachers and parents were students.

Parents and carers could reinforce this at home by having students work out how much change is required when grocery shopping, or talk about the themes in a television show together.

Illawarra South East Performing

On Friday 17 -Sunday 19 February the Illawarra South East Performing Ensemble held their repertoire camp where the students in the ensemble learnt the repertoire for this year's tour program. Corinne Green was selected for this prestigious ensemble and travelled to Wollongong for the camp.

The students had to work extremely hard and also had to work together in order to put together a one hour show in three days ready for taking on tour to schools throughout NSW in



2017. The band members needed to learn over 16 band charts, the dancers to 8 pieces of choreography and the vocalists 8-10 pieces of music.

The students were required to spend the 3 days in constant rehearsal from 7am – 9pm with very little down time. This enabled the students to put on a 1 hour show for the parents on Sunday afternoon. The team of dedicated teachers who worked with the students throughout the 3 days all remarked on the success of the camp and the parents who attended the Sunday afternoon parent concert were all blown away by how much the students had learnt and the level of professionalism of the group even in this short amount of time.

Every student involved in the ensemble demonstrated outstanding commitment, teamwork and dedication to mastering their required parts. Their behaviour and attitude throughout the three days was exemplary and every student was a pleasure to have on camp. All the ensemble teachers were extremely proud of each and every ensemble member.



Questacon Smart Skills Visit

16th On Thursday of February, Questacon visited Yass High School to present their new workshop, Smart Skills, to groups of students from years 7, 8, 9 and 10. Students were given a creative challenge to build a device from paper, foil and tape that would stay aloft in a wind tunnel for more than 15 seconds. Using a process called "protostorming", combination а of prototyping and brainstorming, the students were given 10 minutes to come up with 50 designs. Yass students proved to have superior skills at this producing more than 80 designs in the given time.



The next challenge was group based and involved getting their designs to do specific things in the wind tunnel including hovering, spinning around or flying out of the top of the wind tunnel. Using the knowledge from the protostorming, Yass students were able to come up with a number of interesting and innovative designs that astonished the Questacon presenters.

Parking and picking up in the afternoon

A reminder to parents and carers to park only in the designated spaces on the left hand side of the exit road in the afternoon. Bus drivers have advised us that cars parked closer to the school are making it difficult for buses to turn. There is also some parking on the right hand side of the exit road.

Parents and carers are reminded not to pick up students anywhere on the entrance road as buses require this area to be free from parked cars.

Students must cross only at the crossings to access cars on either side of the exit road.

If parents/carers find the front of the school too busy in the afternoon, you can organise to collect students at Victoria Park or the pool carpark. Both of these areas can be accessed without crossing roads. Students should not walk through the staff carpark if choosing this alternative pick up spot.
