GOOD NEWS STORY



The Peace Pole movement was started in Japan by the visionary Masahisa Goi

He was deeply distressed by the catastrophic devastation caused by the atomic bombs dropped on **Hiroshima** and Nagasaki, instantly killing an estimated 200 000 people.

In 1955 he began a mission to spread this simple message

'May Peace Prevail on Earth'

This peace pole is one of over 500 planted across Australia. It joins over 250 000 planted worldwide.



John Brassil from Yass Rotary presented Theia Asimus with a 'Peace Pole'. The concept of let there be 'Peace on Earth' was turned into a movement by Masahia Goi who survived both nuclear bomb attacks on Japan at the end of World War Two. Yass Rotary funded the erecting of several Peace Pole's to celebrate their 70th birthday.

Mrs WENDY TUCKERMAN (Goulburn) - I rise to recognise Liana Deery a Year 10 student at Yass High School. Liana was recently recognised at the 2024 Swimming ACT Awards night held in August. Former Petria Thomas Olympian. OAM. who represented Australia at the 1996, 2000 and 2004 Olympics was in attendance and presented Liana with the fifteen Years Girls Champion trophy at the awards night. Liana competed in multiple events and medalled in the Open (15 years and over) 200m Individual Medley event, placing third, receiving a bronze medal at the ACT Swimming Championships in February earlier this year. Liana had previously reached Australian National Age level, competing on the Gold Coast in 2023 in both butterfly and backstroke events.



I sincerely congratulate Liana on these wonderful achievements and recognise both the dedication required to compete at this level and the demands of managing training and schoolwork. I wish you all the best Liana with continuing success in your swimming and all your future goals.

Many local Tradies work across the border and are more likely to employ young people with these qualifications.


These students have shown dedication and passion for reading through their commitment to the challenge over an impressive number of years.






Students must sign in and out at the front office if arriving or departing outside normal school hours. Parents can add a note on Compass to explain the absence, but students are still required to sign out.
