Dear Parents, Guardians, and Students,


It has been another busy and productive fortnight at Yass High School, with many exciting achievements and opportunities for our students.

More Swimming Success for Yass High Students at Zone and Regional level.

Yass High swimmers continued their dominance at Zone level with Yass winning the **Zone carnival** convincingly by over 200 points from Mulwaree and Karabar.

Felicity Shannon 17G, Kaylee Douven 16G and Jake Deery 15B were named aged champion on the day after impressive performances. Jake broke the 15B 100m Breaststroke record whilst Felicity improved her own record in the 200m Freestyle.

We had 40 of the 46 swimmers make it through to the regional carnival. Yass' dominance could be seen through the number of relay teams making it through. Only 2 relay teams didn't make it on to the next carnival.

DEBATING SEASON KICKS OFF WITH A WIN




The senior YHS debating team have began the debating season with a victory in the first round of the Premiers Debating Competition.


What's been happening in Textiles?


